INFORMATION REGARDING SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarships for the Online Trainings are covering the full tuition fee and they are funded by the KBA-NotaSys Integrity Fund

Please, mind the terms applicable to scholarships and associated responsibilities, outlined in the General Terms and Conditions for Professional Training.

Eligibility & selection criteria

All Female participants who are working in business or compliance in the private sector. Priority will be given to those from [Least Developed Countries \(LDC\)](#) and have not been granted any scholarship by IACA before.

Scholarships will be granted on the basis of availability and a competitive selection process. The selection process will take into account in particular the merits of the applicant in view of scholarship holders' responsibilities stated below.

Application

If you fulfil the eligibility criteria and agree with the rules outlined above, you may apply online to the training and submit an application for scholarship to the email address (edu@iaca.int).

Scholarship applications will be accepted until **four days before** the start of the programme.

Your request shall be accompanied by the following documents:

- a. *Curriculum Vitae*;
- b. Passport copy;
- c. Statement of motivation, with no more than 600 words, in English (preferably) or in the language the course is offered (this document shall be submitted in .pdf format);
- d. Optionally, in support of your application, you may submit your professional references.

IACA may request you to submit additional information/documentation.

Scholarship participants will be required after completion of the course and within 3 months of course completion to submit an impact story based on personal experiences/reflections on what they have achieved/done or how they are using the knowledge and skills they obtained during the training courses to advance the clean business agenda and to eradicate gendered impacts of corruption on women.
