
Pursuant to Article V of the *Agreement for the Establishment of the International Anti-Corruption Academy as an International Organization* (the IACA Agreement), the Assembly serves as a forum for the Parties to consult on the overall policy of the organization and on other matters of interest. Please observe that the time allocated for general statements by delegations under the agenda item "General discussion" is limited to the morning session. Therefore, to allow for all interested representatives to take the floor, statements should be no longer than three minutes. Please inform the Secretariat as soon as possible about your intention to speak under the agenda item "General discussion".

Delegations of the IACA Parties are required to submit credentials to attend the AoP with full powers. The names of the persons constituting the Party's delegation should also be provided. In accordance with Chapter VI of the AoP Rules of Procedure (RoP), the credentials can be issued by the Head of State or Government, by the Minister for Foreign Affairs, or by the duly accredited Permanent Representative to IACA. In the case of an international organization, credentials should be issued by the competent authority of that organization.

Informal rounds of consultations among IACA's Parties to discuss draft resolutions are intended to be organized in preparation for the session.

The Secretariat will continue to monitor the situation related to the COVID-19 pandemic and will provide timely updates to the Constituency, including registered participants, and on the website of the session with respect to any necessary changes to the above arrangements and possible restrictions affecting access to the Vienna International Centre.
