Guidelines Voluntary Financial Pledges: Explanatory Note

IACA promotes the prevention of and the fight against corruption through education, training and research, and by fostering international cooperation and networking opportunities. Its activities are partly financed through voluntary contributions. In reiterating the need for reliable budgetary planning and allocation of resources, IACA calls on all Parties and Signatories for shared financial ownership. IACA also appeals to other potential donors to contribute to its cause.

As IACA seeks to develop its capacities further in line with its declared mandate and its agreed Work Programme, it is dependent on stable finances and reliable resources in order to effectively maintain its operational work and activities, such as strengthening research capacities and faculty.

In this context, IACA invites Parties and Signatories, as well as other stakeholders, to use the fifth session of the Assembly of Parties from 10 to 11 November 2016 for pledging financial contributions. The envisaged high-level/ministerial segment on 10 November 2016 will especially allow for high visibility, positive political exposure, and enhanced commitment.

What should a financial pledge be about?

According to Regulation 10 paragraph 1 of the *Financial Framework of the International Anti-Corruption Academy*, voluntary contributions shall preferably include contributions to the general budget of the Academy.

Examples of pledges:
