

## Daniel LI Ming-chak



**Mr. Daniel LI Ming-chak** has been Deputy Commissioner and Head of Operations at the Independent Commission against Corruption (ICAC) of the People's Republic of China since 2002.

Mr. LI received his university education in Hong Kong, China, and the USA in the early 1970s.

He joined the ICAC in 1977 as an Investigator and was promoted to the ranks of Chief Investigator in 1983, Principal Investigator in 1986 and Assistant Director of Operations in 1993. During this period he was responsible for the investigation of corruption, intelligence-gathering and international liaison. Mr. LI was appointed Director of Investigation (Government Sector) in 1996 and as such oversaw public sector corruption investigations and prevention.

In 1998, Mr. LI was awarded the ICAC Medal for Distinguished Service by the Chief Executive of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (HKSAR). In 2000, Mr. LI was appointed Director of Investigation (Private Sector) overseeing private sector corruption investigations and departmental support.

Between 1999 and 2002, Mr. LI was a member of the Interpol International Group of Experts on Corruption (IGEC).

A practitioner in fighting corruption for over thirty-three years, he is currently a member of the HKSAR Advisory Committee on Corruption, advising and reviewing policy matters, strategic approaches, and overall administration of the ICAC. He is also Chairman of the Training and Development Committee responsible for the provision locally and overseas of training to graft fighters on legislation, investigation, prevention and education.
