

Muzong Kodi



Mr. Muzong Kodi is currently an international consultant and researcher focusing on governance, anti-corruption matters, human rights and civil society organizations in Africa. He is also an Associate Fellow of the Africa Programme of the Royal Institute of International Affairs (Chatham House) in London, U.K., where he coordinates the Congo Forum.

Mr. Kodi holds a PhD degree in African History from Northwestern University, U.S. He started his career as an academic, teaching first at the University of Lubumbashi in the Democratic Republic of Congo from 1976 to 1979 and then at the University of Nairobi, Kenya, from 1979 to 1983. From 1983 to 1993 he was Director of Publications at the African Centre for Monetary Studies in Dakar, Senegal. He then worked for international non-governmental organizations, including Amnesty International (as Director of International Development from 1994 to 2002) and Transparency International (as Regional Director for Africa and the Middle East from 2002 to 2005).

He is Vice-Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Diamond Development Initiative International and a member of the Boards of Directors of the Electoral Institute of Southern Africa and the African Institute for Governing with Integrity.

He has published extensively on governance and anti-corruption issues and has worked as a consultant for many organizations including the African Union Commission, UNODC, the European Commission, the Department for International Development of the U.K., the U4 Anti-Corruption Resource Centre and the Institute for Security Studies and the Open Society of Southern Africa (OSISA).
