Invitation for IACA alumni to submit proposal for Alumni Reunion 2018 programme session

Do you have expertise, research, or an idea related to any of the below topics that you'd like to share at the Alumni Reunion 2018?

This year, IACA is offering its Alumni the possibility to contribute to the official Alumni Reunion programme planned for 5 and 6 July 2018. We are looking for international practitioners and academics to share best practices and lessons learned in anti-corruption and anti-corruption compliance with fellow alumni.

Topics of interest for the reunion:

- Anti-Corruption and Compliance in NGOs, Civil Society, and Aid Organizations: Monitoring Mechanisms from Within and From Outside
- Corruption and Migration
- Corruption and Technology / Digitalization / Big Data / Blockchain
- Privacy and Cyber-Security
- Regulatory Change Management
- Behavioural Science Perspective on Corruption
- Theoretical Frameworks of Compliance Benchmarking
- Collective Action Theory Applied to the Study of Corruption
- Localizing Anti-Corruption Compliance Programmes of Multinational Companies
- Third Party Due Diligence in Anti-Corruption Compliance Management Systems
- Third Party Risk Management in Anti-Corruption Compliance
- Supply Chain Management in Anti-Corruption Compliance
- Whistle-blower Protection as a Corruption Prevention Measure
- Asset Declaration as a Corruption Prevention Measure
- Codes of Conduct Within the Framework of a Compliance Management System
- Individual Liability of Compliance Officers
- Corporate Criminal Liability for Corruption Offences
- Monitoring and Evaluation of Compliance Programmes

This list is not final, and alumni are also welcome to submit proposals for other topics related to the field of anti-corruption and anti-corruption compliance. In case you have another topic you wish to present to alumni during the Reunion, please submit your proposal to IACA by the deadline.

Each session is 30 minutes long and it is foreseen to have a 15 minute presentation and 15 minutes for Q&A and discussion. On 5 July, the Alumni session is scheduled for 17:15-17:45. On 6 July we have two sessions available; one from 12:45-13:15 and the last session from 17:30-18:00.

Application process and rules:

Interested alumni should send their proposal to alumni@iaca.int by 31 May 2018. After the application deadline, IACA will review all proposals and choose three best ones to be presented during the official Alumni Reunion 2018 programme, taking into consideration the criteria defined in this invitation for submission, including the proposal's creativity, innovation, style, and impact.

The proposal should be maximum two pages, outlining 1) the session topic/title, 2) the importance of the topic, and 3) brief summary of what will be covered during the 15 minutes. The topics proposed should cover “cutting edge” issues and problems surrounding these topics, with a link to practical impacts. Proposals should be written in English and must be the author’s personal work with sources properly referenced. Internationally accepted ethical standards of drafting are to be adhered to (e.g. no plagiarism). Only one proposal per person will be accepted.

Decisions will be made in early June 2018 and communicated by email to alumni who are selected to present during the reunion. If he/she does not respond to IACA within 7 days of being notified, his/her opportunity to present during the Reunion will be forfeited and IACA shall be entitled to select another alumni presenter. IACA’s decision shall be final.

Alumni whose proposal is accepted should still apply for the Alumni Reunion as regular alumni participants, and are responsible for covering Reunion tuition, and other expenses related to their attendance (travel, accommodation, etc.).
