PROGRAMME BENEFITS

The training offers a diverse curriculum that combines comprehensive insight from several academic disciplines with practical know-how. Benefits for participants include:

- in-depth understanding of the nature of corruption in local governance
- access to world-leading academics and practitioners in the field
- knowledge-sharing and discussion with peers from around the globe
- exposure to the latest anti-corruption strategies and case studies
- analysis of cities and local government institutions at various stages of development

PROGRAMME STRUCTURE

- Transparency, accountability, and public participation at the local level
