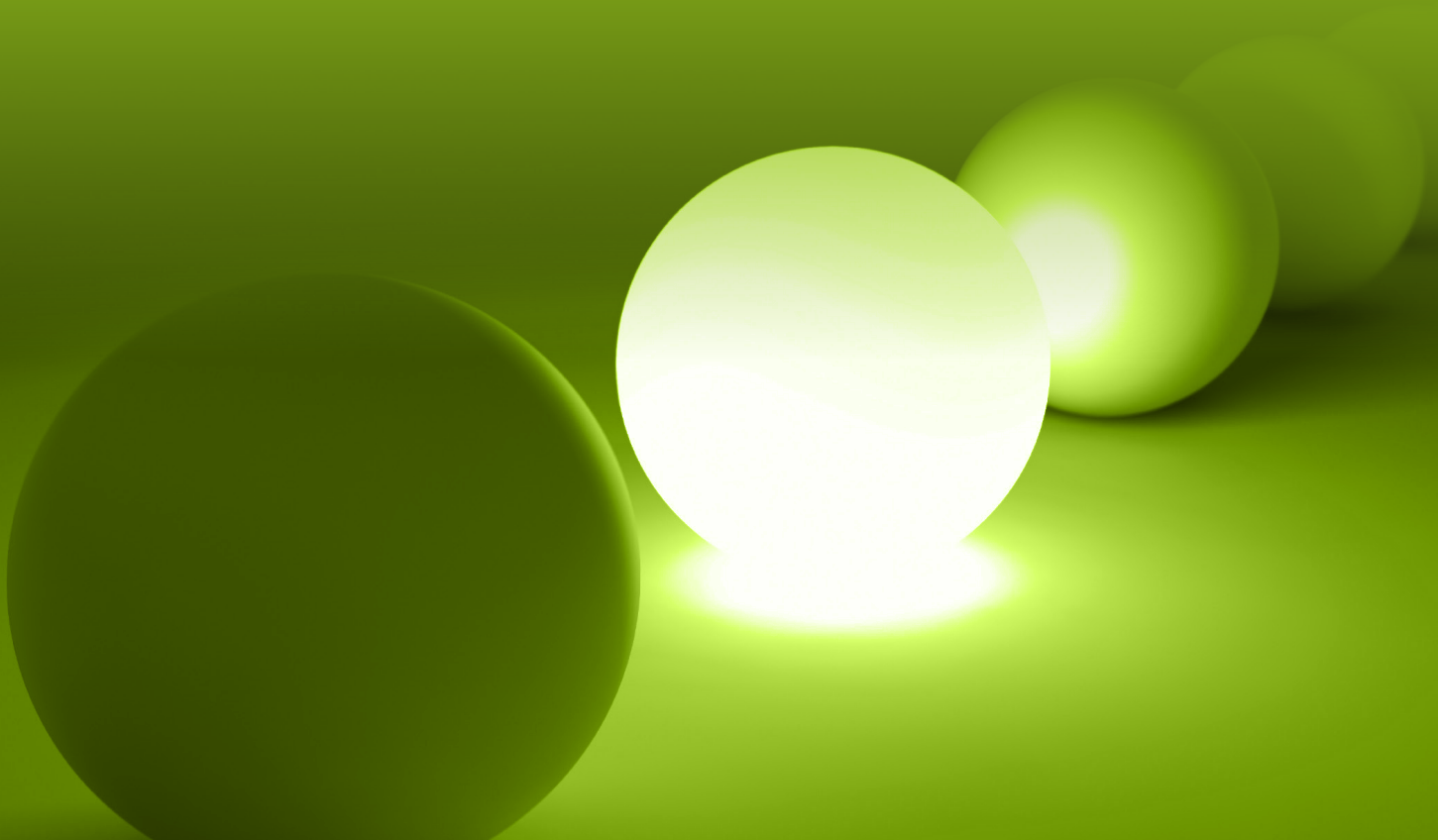
Selected participants are exempt from tuition fees, which will be entirely covered by the Siemens Integrity Initiative, but are required to pay an administrative fee of EUR 100.

IACA'S NEW LICIT TRAINING TAKES PLACES IN MARCH 2014

IACA is proud to announce the call for applications for the Legal Incentives for Corporate Integrity Training (LICIT). Interested candidates are encouraged to apply before 22 December 2013.

WHAT DOES LICIT OFFER?

In today's economic environment, business ethics and an active stance against corruption are no longer a choice, but a necessity for sustainable success. In response, LICIT aims to increase awareness on the need for a system of incentives, both within organizations and in their competitive work environment, as well as to foster an atmosphere where businesses are encouraged to come forward and report incidents of corruption.

Besides traditional enforcement practices, the training will focus on contributing to the creation of a system of legal incentives to support private actors' integrity efforts, and in particular that of self-reporting. This training provides its participants with a foundation on the relevant provisions of the UNCAC and other legal obligations, in an effort to facilitate private actors' compliance with the 10th Principle of the UN Global Compact, which states: "Businesses should work against corruption in all its forms, including extortion and bribery."

HOW IS THE PROGRAMME STRUCTURED?

LICIT will run over the course of three days, from 24 to 26 March 2014. The training contains a mix of lectures and interactive sessions. It will take place at the IACA campus in Laxenburg (Vienna), Austria. Course topics will focus on UNCAC provisions relating to the private sector as well as other relevant frameworks, engaging the private sector, corporate integrity, leadership responsibility, the institutionalization of integrity through anti-corruption programmes, transparency and public participation, sanctions, incentives and additional measures. The programme is taught by leading international experts from both the public and private sectors.

WHO CAN APPLY?

The programme is designed for anti-corruption experts, business and government executives, leaders of civil society organizations, and academics. Candidates must have a minimum of three years of relevant work experience, or alternatively, a level of junior engagement demonstrating their potential. Proficiency in written and spoken English is also a prerequisite. IACA is committed to promoting diversity and strives to attract participants from various regional and professional backgrounds.
